### Terms and Conditions

- All fees are to be paid by the dates given above, either by cheque or BACS, as detailed on the invoice.
- Students who have not paid the first instalment by the deadline will not be able to start their programme. Failure to pay the second instalment on time will likely result in removal from the programme.
- All fees include the cost of registration with the appropriate University (where applicable), library access and catering. There is a supplementary £275.00 charge per annum for those studying on Thursday evenings in Chelmsford to cover additional catering.
- Fees for Church of England sponsored ordinands are paid by Ministry Division, not the ordinand.
- Fees for Licensed Lay Ministry (LLM) students are arranged with the relevant Diocese (either Chelmsford or London), and do not follow the above.
- Students attending Teaching Weeks – which take place in our London centre – should be aware of additional costs which they will be expected to cover. These include, where necessary, accommodation, travel and food expenses.
- Students attending optional trips to Rome and the Holy Land will incur these costs at their own expense.

### Bursaries and Scholarships

- Unless otherwise stated above, we are unfortunately unable to offer any bursaries or scholarships.

### Student Finance

- For students to be eligible for Student Finance, they must be studying on an accredited programme. We have made an application to the new HE regulator, the Office For Students, to be registered as an HE Provider. If our application is successful, this will mean that all our accredited programmes will be eligible for Student Finance in 2019-20. We expect this application process to be completed in early 2019.
- Those wishing to access student finance for undergraduate programmes should indicate this clearly on the reply slip when accepting their place. We will then expect payment from Student Finance, and you will not be invoiced.
- If a Student Finance application is unsuccessful, the student is responsible for the programme fees.
